(A**) Of descendants of this uterine sister of Lady Elizabeth of the Manor 7407, [***Lady Mary of the Manor] number 9027 in the Herd Book, there are only about half-a-dozen in existence, all in Ireland. The dam, Countess of Kilbride, was unregistered; the sire Corse 1688, was bred at Confunderland, near Alford, Aberdeenshire, [***Scotland] in 1879, out of an unregistered cow. Lady Mary herself was calved on March 5th, 1884, the property of the pioneer Irish breeder, Fletcher Moore, Manor-Kilbride, Co. Dublin." — "Her [***Lady Elizabeth 7407 and Lady Mary 9027] dam was a 'pure Aberdeen or Angus polled cow,' Countess of Kilbride, by Viscount of Blessington 2391, himself out of an "Aberdeen or Angus" cow by Earl of Blessington 2060. This bull was a Mayflower of Montbleton [***prominent herd in Scotland], tracing back to Craigo 260 and Lady Craigo 99. There are less than a score of cows of this family left, but it seems to be slowly increasing." [***Inserted for clarity] Quotes taken from Keith, Alexander M.A. Reprinted January 1976. (B**) "Manor Kilbride, on the high-lying northern borders of County Wicklow, some three miles nearer Dublin than Blessington, is situated Manor Kilbride, the beautiful residence of Mr. Fletcher Moore, D.L., whose herd is well known. The estate is admirably adapted for stock breeding, though the stock must be hardy to thrive in the district, where the winter is severe. Mr. Moore has therefore had to select his stock for their robustness, and they show very good- thriving qualities when introduced to more genial surroundings. The farm of Kilbride was taken over by Mr. Fletcher Moore in 1879 from his father, Mr. Scott Moore. There were then only a few Aberdeen- Angus cows, and sires were used that belonged to Mr. William Owen, Blessington. Mr. Moore began his registration in Vol. viii. of the Herd Book (1883) with Elizabeth of the Manor 7407, also entering her dam Countess of Kilbride."
